Hi folks,

In early May I went to the Alpha Leadership Conference at the Royal Albert Hall in London - organised by those who run the Alpha course. It's been going for 30 years, but it's the first time that I've been there. As well as having a range of talks, they also had a number of interviews with people who are in the limelight - which were often very inspiring and thought-provoking.

One of these was with the historian Tom Holland. He's written a much-acclaimed book called "Dominion: The Making of the Western Mind". His basic argument has been to recognise the fundamental role that Christianity

has had in shaping the culture and history of western Europe over the last two thousand years.

As it happens, Tom Holland is actually an agnostic, and not a Christian. He was asked what advice he would have for the church today. His answer was unexpected and insightful. The gist of what he said was this: There's not much point in the social care, because lots of other people do that these days; so stick to what makes Christianity unique - the weird stuff - the supernatural stuff - because everything else is covered. Christians are sometimes embarrassed by the supernatural stuff - but we shouldn't be, because by it we recognize a supernatural God.
