Hi folks,

Where do we turn for hope in a world full of crisis?

We're coming to the Easter season, when Christians celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus. This is the centrepoint of Christianity, the fulcrum around which everything turns. But what if it's all just a myth?

There's little doubt that Jesus was a historical figure: the evidence, even outside the Bible, is too strong. But why should we trust the stories of Jesus's death and resurrection? Two quick points:



He was really dead - In John's gospel, the

Jewish leaders wanted no dead bodies remaining on the crosses before Passover, so the soldiers were sent to break the legs of those crucified. But as Jesus was already dead, "one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water." We now know scientifically how the separation of blood is an immediate sign of death, which shows that Jesus was really dead.

**He really rose again** — When Thomas doubted that Jesus had really risen, he insisted that he touch the nail marks in Jesus hands and feet to be sure it really was Jesus. A few days later, Jesus appeared and told Thomas to do exactly that, to know that he had bodily risen from the dead.

Through the events of Good Friday and Easter, we see that God is sovereign even over life and death itself. Faith in Jesus, the risen son of God, provides an anchor when the world around us seems so uncertain, and gives us hope for the future.
