DECEMBER 2023

Hi folks,

The world around us feels very unsettled at the moment: wars in Ukraine and Gaza (not to mention others in Myanmar and Sudan); climate change; and problems at home with, for example, the NHS struggling to cope with increased demands on it. It would be natural to feel anxious and worried about the global political scene.

It can be re-assuring then to come to the Christmas season – to a familiar tradition, with carols, Christmas trees and turkey. However, none of these traditional things reflect the turbulent world into which Jesus was born.

First century Israel was a very unsettled country: it had an uneasy relationship with the surrounding Roman Empire. In the recent past it had been under Syrian occupation. It did not feel like the God's Promised Land for the Jewish people – anything but.

The ancient promises of a Messiah were a glimmer of hope for an oppressed people: but what they were expecting was a military leader, a new King David, who would lead the nation to overthrow their Roman oppressors. They were not expecting a baby born in a manger who would preach a gospel of peace, heal the sick, comfort the broken-hearted, and end up being crucified. Yet God's answer in the turbulence was not a new King David, but a suffering servant called Jesus.

If you're a Christian living in Ukraine or Gaza, Myanmar or Sudan, you would be able to relate to the turbulent world of first century Israel, the world into which Jesus was born. Maybe, in the 21st century western world, we struggle to understand who Jesus is because we're too comfortable?
