Hi folks,

We're beginning to see the first glimmerings of the end of the Covid-19 pandemic. The omicron variant is genuinely weaker than others, and we might be seeing signs of the virus becoming – in years to come – like a bad cold. Meanwhile, a friend of mine (who was anti-vax) is on life support – a stark reminder of the current seriousness of the disease.



As we emerge from the pandemic, there will be plenty of discussion about whether the right decisions were taken by the Government, by the Church of England and by other organisations. At the moment there's a lot of attention on what was or was not happening at the Prime Minister's house in Downing Street, and whether he himself was involved. This is not about whether the right policies were being taken in combatting the virus, but about the integrity of those making the rules.

If those making the rules then break them flagrantly, it seriously undermines the confidence of the wider population. People will be less inclined to follow the rules, giving the police a harder job enforcing the rules while at the same time being disillusioned by the double-standards of policy-makers. It then becomes part of a downward spiral. The personal integrity of lawmakers is therefore absolutely vital.

Fortunately, our relationship with God does not depend on fallible human beings – because God is utterly trustworthy, no matter what our personal circumstances. If our lives have an anchor in God, then we can withstand the storms of life.
