#### **NOVEMBER 2023**

Hi folks,

As I write, there are two world cups going on: one in rugby and one in cricket. Currently, it's far better to be an England rugby fan than an England cricket fan!

In both tournaments, the world's top sportsmen are on show: there is some exceptional talent on display. In both competitions, the players have the ability to do things that normal people can't do. But — are they at the top because they have exceptional ability — or because they are able to do the basics exceptionally well?

When a team is doing poorly, the problems are usually less about lack of

brilliance, and more about failure to do the basics well enough (for example, dropped catches in cricket, or missed tackles in rugby). At the top level of sport, exceptional ability can really only flourish by being built on the foundation of basic skills being done exceptionally well. These days, because there's so much analytical data available, if a player has a weakness in the basics, it can easily be found and exploited – irrespective of brilliance elsewhere.

As a group of churches, we have been doing a course called "Four cornerstones". The main message of the course is that if we want to build a thriving church in this area, we need to start with the basics – and to do that, we need to make sure we have good foundations. Right at the heart of that is our relationship with God through Jesus, which we cultivate through prayer and Bible reading. As we approach Christmas, we'll be able to think again about what it means for God to come to Earth in the form of a baby: the event which is so basic to Christian faith.
