The American elections take place during November. The result will have a profound effect on global politics, whether NATO, or climate change, or the war in Ukraine, or any other topic of global political interest. In one way, this is true of all American elections, because of the strength and power of the American nation.

However, there is widespread concern about another aspect: the integrity of the entire democratic system. The candidate at



the heart of the Capital Hill riots in January 2021 has recently called them "an act of love". If he loses, what are the chances of his accepting the loss? If he wins, what are the chances of free and fair elections in 2028?

Winston Churchill once remarked that:

...it has been said that democracy is the worst form of Government except all those other forms that have been tried from time to time...

Democracy may have many flaws, but it has the one major virtue that the Government is accountable to the entire electorate.

While it cannot be said that democracy is a Biblical concept (it isn't), justice is at the heart of God's relationship with his people: hence the law codes of the Old Testament. Respecting the democratic system is one aspect of respecting the rule of law. If a democratically-elected ruler shows contempt for both democracy and justice, then you know that troubling times are ahead.

If you pray, pray for democracy and the rule of law to be upheld.
