Hi folks,

We live in a time of great uncertainty. The saga with American tariffs has at least calmed down after a turbulent week - but could easily re-ignite in a few months' time. The wars between Russia and Ukraine, and between Israel and Hamas, continue unabated; meanwhile, in the UK, it's hard to find an area of British life that doesn't seem to be over-stretched.

This could easily lead us to despair - or it could lead us to seek more of God. For some of us, this will be about deepening a relationship with God that we already have; for others, it will be about desiring to know whether there really is a God in the first place.

For those of us belonging to Generation X (ie in their 40s and 50s), this may be a



The challenge for the church is to be able to adapt to the changing needs of our times: to be able to respond to the needs of those desiring to know about God, but not necessarily in a formal, institutionalised way.
