This may not seem an obvious photo: it's a field with a few sparse maize plants, with a rather fetching swathe of flowering field bindweed in the distance. But there are other stories that can be told.



It makes one realise

that it's a hard a job for farmers to pick the right crop at the start of the season, without knowing the weather ahead — especially with the uncertainities introduced by climate change. As it happens there was a good barley harvest from the neighbouring field. There's an increasing need for drought-resistant crops, able to withstand the reality of a warming climate.

I took the photo partly because this scene also reminded me of photos that are used to illustrate drought in parts of Africa. 46 million people were affected by the drought in the Horn of Africa from 2020 to 2023 – and this summer is affecting countries like Egypt and Sudan in the north and Angola and Zambia towards the south particularly badly.

Global warming is not just a problem for countries far away – but for us as well. We need to let photos like this one remind us that we're all connected by this global problem – so that we need to be taking our share of responsibility. If you pray, pray that we do exactly that – and pray for wisdom as to the steps we need to take to alleviate these global issues.
